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## **Estonian Candidate Study 2019**

Overview of answers

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## Overview

Estonian Candidate Study 2019 collected information about candidates who stood at the 2019 parliamentary election in Estonia. The survey included questions about candidates' political background, political attitudes, and their campaign choices.

The study was conducted after the election. There were 359 complete responses.

## Conclusions

### Political background

- Most candidates (53.5%) have been local councillors
  - Most common for candidates of the Estonian Centre Party (88.6%)
  - Least common for candidates of the Estonian Greens (17.2%)
- Most candidates (63.3%) have held regional party office
  - Most popular non-party political organisations are business groups (52.5% candidates) and sports clubs (31.7% candidates)
  - Very few candidates have been members of environmental groups (14.3%), women's organisations (14.4%), or trade unions (19.3%)
- Very few candidates received encouragement to stand for office
  - Most common source of encouragement was national party official (29% candidates)

### Election campaign

- Candidates are conducting relatively party-centred campaigns
- Candidates are conducting relatively intensive campaigns
  - Average spend on personal campaign: €1,830
    - Highest spend for candidates of the Estonian Centre Party: €4,120
    - Lowest spend for candidates of the Estonian Greens: €300
  - Average time spend on campaigning: 11.8 hours per week
    - Most time by Conservative People's Party of Estonia candidates: 18.1 hours per week
    - Least time by Estonian Greens candidates: 5.5 hours per week
- Social media has become the most popular campaign mean (used by 77.6% of candidates)
  - However, very few candidates used other online campaign means (all <30% of candidates)
  - Campaign means that more than half of candidates used: social media (77.6%), party flyers (70.9%)

### Political views

- Most important issue: social cohesion (18.7% candidates) and running of country (16.7% candidates)
  - Economy is the most important issue only for the Estonian Reform Party candidates (38.3%)
- Estonian political landscape is slightly skewed to the right
  - Social Democratic Party candidates are most left-leaning (3.7; scale 0 'left' – 10 'right')
  - Reform Party, CPPE, and Fatherland candidates are most right-leaning (8.0)

- Immigration
  - Vast majority of candidates (92.1%) thinks that immigrants must adopt to Estonian customs
  - Few candidates (34.9%) think that obtaining Estonian citizenship should be made easier
- Most polarising topics
  - People who break law should receive stiffer sentences: 45.1% agree, 42.3% disagree
  - Recognition of same-sex partnerships was a correct decision: 45.2% agree, 42.3% disagree
- Most common ground
  - Immigrants must adapt to Estonian customs: 91.1% agree
  - State should put more emphasis on protecting the environment: 85.9% agree
  - The most important task of the state is to ensure citizens' social security: 85.1% agree

## Democracy

- Most candidates are relatively satisfied with how democracy works in Estonia (78% very/quite) and in the European Union (73.8% very/quite)
  - Conservative People's Party of Estonia candidates are the exception, with most of them being dissatisfied with how it works in Estonia (78.4% not very/not at all) and the European Union (76.4% not very/not at all)
  - A substantial minority of the Estonian Centre Party candidates are also dissatisfied with how it works in Estonia (37.9% not very/not at all) and the European Union (44.8% not very/not at all)
- There are reasons for concern:
  - Only a small majority of candidates (56.9%) think that citizens have enough opportunities to shape political decisions,
  - Around half of candidates (52%) think that democracy is in danger of losing citizens' trust,
  - More than half of candidates (59.4%) think that lobby groups have too much influence over legislation, and
  - More than half (55%) think that citizens should have the right to initiate binding referendums
- Most candidates think that Members of Parliament should be independent-minded politicians
  - Most candidates (67%) think that Members of Parliament should prioritise their own views over those of their voters when the two are in conflict
  - Most candidates (68.6%) think that Members of Parliament should prioritise their own views over those of their party when the two are in conflict
